



Do you or your lodge have any Norwegian cultural goals for 2012? I'm hoping many of you plan to enter the Cultural Skills Exhibition at the District Convention in June. There is still time for you to complete projects that demonstrate your achievements toward mastering one or more of the Sons of Norway Cultural Skills. Items that have not been entered into the competition for judging previously may be submitted in any of the eligible areas. In addition, this year we are allowing members to submit digital photos which will be compiled into a slide show for delegate viewing at the convention. Digital photos will not be judged and will not be returned to entrants. Entry forms must be submitted for all entries submitted for judging. Forms will be mailed to lodge presidents and will also be available on the District Convention website.

This is a great time of year to be exploring ideas to submit to the Sons of Norway Foundation requesting a **General Heritage and Culture Grant**. The General Heritage and Culture Grants are awarded to individuals, groups or organizations that promote the heritage and culture of traditional or modern Norway. The maximum award is \$3,000. Examples of activities which have received past grants include community festivals, cultural exchange programs, research projects, instructional videos and books, etc. Dream a bit about what you or your lodge could do and apply to make your dream become a reality. The deadline for the General Heritage and Culture Grants is April 1st. This year applications can be made online.

NEED SOME HELP posting your lodge's newsletter? Our web master Jim Dunagan will be able to assist you in getting your newsletter or event issues on the web. More and more lodges are using this option.

Going forward, those interested in publishing to the blog email Jim at webmaster@3dsofn.org. send name, the name of the lodge, and role (officer, newsletter editor, etc). Jim can quickly create a new account and temporary password and acknowledge that. You can communicate directly with Jim in the future with any questions. The website Event Calendar is another place lodges have to specifically promote upcoming events.

[How To Upload And Publish Your Newsletter!](#) April 7, 2011 by Jim Dunagan

We're getting more and more wonderful content posted to our blog, which is great. But I know there are some people who are having a little difficulty in getting lodge newsletters on the blog. Here are some (hopefully!) easy steps to follow. I suggest that you print out these instructions and have them near the computer when you're ready to go!

First, make sure that your newsletter is in PDF (Adobe Acrobat) format. Newer (2007/2010) versions of Microsoft Word will allow you to save as a PDF. A search for "PDF Converters" will return a number of free and easy-to-use tools that can do the job as well.

Now, with your PDF newsletter saved, log in to the "admin" side of the blog with your username and password. You can actually do it from this page by clicking the "Site Admin" link near the lower right-hand corner of the page.

If you don't have a username or password for the blog yet, please email your Zone Director and I can get you set up.

Once you are logged in, you will be at what is called the "Dashboard" page—it's kind of a launching pad for working behind the scenes with the blog. You will have access to anything you have created there. You'll start by clicking the "Add New" link from the "Posts" box near the upper left-hand corner of the page. You'll be taken to the "Add New Post" page.

First, I'd like you to enter a title for your post ("post" is basically blog terminology for whatever content you'll be publishing). It needs to be short and descriptive (like, "April 2011 Oslo Lodge Newsletter"). The cursor should already be positioned to enter the title; otherwise, it's the box marked "Enter Title Here". Next, find the "Categories" box on the right-hand side of the page and make sure "Lodge Newsletters" is checked and anything else is not checked. This part is pretty important, so please don't forget, OK?

Next, I'd like you to put the cursor in the large box beneath the tool bar and type a sentence or maybe two about your newsletter. It doesn't have to be much ("Here's the April 2011 edition of the Oslo Lodge Newsletter. We hope you enjoy it!"). Then, hit the "Enter" or "Return" key so that the cursor skips to the next line.

Next, look above the tool bar for 4 icons next to the words "Upload/Insert". Choose the far-right icon (kind of looks like the sun). If you hover over it, it will say "Add Media". Click that icon, which opens a new window with the same name. Click the "Select Files" button, which will open a dialog box for you to navigate to the location on your computer where the PDF file is located. Click on it, and then click "Open". Your file will be uploaded in a few seconds, and then the box will change to show a thumbnail of your newsletter file. Scroll down this window and look for a button that says "Insert Into Post". Click that button, and the new window will close and a link with your newsletter should now be where the cursor is/was blinking. If everything looks OK, click the "Publish" button just to your right, and you are done!

If something doesn't look right, feel free to delete what's been typed and start again. Remember that the link will display whatever file name you gave your newsletter. This might be a good time to make sure your newsletter file has a simple name—like whatever you plan to be the title, perhaps? If you uploaded something else by mistake, or you decided you should rename the file, you can delete the file you uploaded quite easily. Click the "Add Media" button, then click the "Media Library" tab. Your upload should be at the top of the list. If there is a "Show" link next to it, click the link. Scroll down the window and find the "Delete" link. Click it, and then confirm your deletion.

I hope this has answered all your questions without getting you bogged down in details. If you have any questions, please email me and I'll be happy to help if I can. Jim 3D Webmaster

From the Secretary Marci Larson

Please make a note that several activities are underway in the next few weeks with a time line that may need your action or that of your lodge. Here is an outline.

- The **District Membership Directory** is being updated and will be available for distribution about March 1. Each lodge receives one complimentary copy and additional copies are \$6 apiece. This is a \$1 increase from last year because of increased postal rates. The order form has been sent to the lodge presidents and secretaries, but if you would like a copy please let me know. I base the quantity printed on the number of orders received by Friday, Feb. 10. Orders received after that date will be available on a first come basis as quantity remains.
- **Lodge Delegates** - Lodges are entitled to elect delegates, based on membership as of Dec. 31, to represent them at the District Convention June 20 - 23. The District Board highly encourages lodges to elect delegates so your lodge voice is heard at the Convention where our district business is conducted every two years. The delegate reporting form and the list with the individual lodge delegate counts have been sent to the lodge presidents and secretaries. The delegate registration is \$299 and the non-delegate rate \$240. Hotel rooms are \$105 per night plus tax. Please access the District website/convention information for further details www.3dsofn.org. For further information re: delegates please read Article III of the District Bylaws found on the website.
- **Resolutions** – Resolutions will be considered at the District Convention so if you wish to submit one, please read. Local lodges or the District Board must submit all proposals to change the District Bylaws to the District Secretary in writing at least four (4) months before the District Convention is held. An affirmative vote of two-thirds is needed to effect a change. Resolutions are also considered and require only a simple majority for adoption. As District Secretary, I will need your proposed resolution(s) no later than Friday, February 24. If you propose a resolution which includes the explicit or implicit expenditure of funds, include an estimate amount of the expenditure and the means by which the necessary funds are to be obtained. Please refer to Article IX of the District Bylaws for additional information.
- It is that time again for District 3 lodges or individuals to nominate an individual for the **District's prestigious Leif Erikson Citation Award** which is presented to a recipient who promotes the ideals of Norwegian culture and heritage. Many dedicated and deserving persons could be honored by this award and certainly have been since its origination in 1967 by the Hartford Lodge. The criteria is as follows: Candidates may be any person or persons who has/have made major or significant contributions

ü As humanitarians

ü In public or charitable services

ü In the fields of sports, education, medicine or the sciences

ü For cultural advancement

Any District 3 member can nominate an individual or individuals for this award. The nominee(s) does not have to be a SON member. The nominator must describe the reasons for the nomination and provide support material such as photos, newspaper or other new media articles. The District President will appoint a

committee to review the submissions and select a list of three nominees to be considered. The Cultural Director chairs the committee. The District Board will select the winner, by a ballot vote, and first and second alternates. This information has been sent to the lodge secretaries and presidents. Because the spring board meeting is March 2-4, it is necessary for lodges and individuals to submit nomination(s) to the District Secretary by Feb. 24. The District Board will make the final selection. The 2010 recipient was SON member Bjarne Livollen from Delancey, NY.
