#### NORWAY TUBFRIM PROJECT HAS BEEN DISCONTINUED

Many thanks to all of our Blå Fjell members who have so generously collected and turned in the TUBFRIM stamps over these many years! I will forward our last box of TUBFRIM stamps before the New Year 2022/2023. Joann Barfield

Tubfrim is closing, as their notice states:

#### TUBFRIM in Nesbyen has been decided to be closed.

The owner of TUBFRIM, the National Association for Public Health, has decided this week to shut down Tubfrim's operations from the summer of 2023.

## The ordinary operations of TUBFRIM will therefore cease from 22. October 2022.

TUBFRIM will continue to accept all used stamps until the New Year 2022/2023, while alternative solutions are being worked on.

The society is digitizing, and the amount of collected stamps has decreased drastically. The last five years, 2017-2021, shows that it will be difficult to produce surplus in the coming years. Therefore, the decision to discontinue operations is necessary.

#### **History:**

TUBFRIM was established in 1928 at Nesbyen by postmaster Ditlef Frantzen. TUBFRIM would collect and sell used stamps. The profits should be used for tuberculosis work among children in Norway. TUBFRIM was transferred to the National Association for Public Health in 1947. TUBFRIM built its own stamp house, Solstad, in 1958. At most, 14 people worked at TUBFRIM. Collection of stamps and other philateli has always been the main activity, although both Telecards and postcards have been additional products in later decades.

There have also been changes to what the profits will be used for. Today, the profits go to health and well-being measures for children and young people in Norway, and to the fight against tuberculosis. From 1928 until 2021 TUBFRIM has distributed NOK 26 million to approximately 2700 good measures.

# TROLL A – THE TALLEST STRUCTURE EVER MOVED BY MANKIND (from Bla Fjell lodge

The move took place in 1996. Located about 80 km off the west coast of Norway 'Troll A', is a colossal natural gas platform and the tallest structure ever moved by mankind. This platform was operated by Statoil and was towed over 200 km from the village of Vats to the North Sea. The event was a televised sensation in Norway.



## \*\*\*\*\*\*\*RECIPE - DANISH BUTTER COOKIES\*\*\*\*\*\*

(from +Larry Norman)

1 lb. butter, softened 1 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 cups sugar 4 cups flour

1 egg

Roll dough into 2" log. (Use center cardboard from paper towel roll and saran wrap). I sprinkle colored sugar around the rolls. Refrigerate 2 hours. Cut into 1/4 "thick slices. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes. Cool a little on baking sheet, then move to cooling racks. Very good – taste like shortbread cookies. Simple to make.

## **SOUPED UP** – article by Nancy Herrick.

(I did not copy picture of Campbell's Soup can but the bolded text below it. The rest of this article is typed with exact wording.)

Cooking with canned goods became a part of the 1950s convenience food trend and Campbell Soup Co. is ready with tips for busy homemakers.

**HOME ECONOMISTS** under Carolyn Campbell devise hundreds of recipes for the 1958 pamphlet Wonderful Ways with Soups. In her introduction, Campbell declares canned soup is handy "for every hour, every purpose: for low-calorie and high-calorie diets; :for the 1-year old and for Gramps." The 64-page booklet includes recipes for Jellied Tongue Salad, Prune or Apricot Upside down Cake, Mincemeat Cake, and Chicken and Eggs on Beans. It also has a version of Tomato Soup Cake, a recipe with roots to at least the 1920s that has proved surprisingly resilient. Variations of it on the company's website get some 65,000 hits every year.
