Cod Liver Oil

(Shared by Kathy Clark)

Something Fishy - Despite its slippery feel and pungent aroma - cod-liver oil is good medicine Do you remember taking a spoonful each day? This was a standard thing in the winter to stay healthy. The Norwegian word for cod-liver is lysi which means light because the oil was used to light their homes. Lofoton still manufactures this today. Norway exports 442 metric tons of this oil annually. In the middle ages the cod liver oil was extracted by leaving liver in huge vats in the summer sun to ferment. It was widely used as a balm to treat injuries. In the 1700's a more efficient method was developed in which the livers were boiled in large cauldrons producing more oil. The smell of the boiling livers was created quite a smell as it wafted over coastal villages. In 1854 a more refined process was developed producing a purer oil.

Cod-liver is very healthy containing Vitamins A and D and omega-3 fatty acids. It was used to treat many diseases. Many people continue to take a daily dose in liquid or gel capsules. Today, in the fall, Norway advertises this supplement to prevent getting a cold and strengthen your health during the winter.

Icelandic Language Lesson.

Did you know that Björk, the famous Icelandic singer/songwriter, gets her name from the Icelandic word for birch? In Icelandic, "björk" is the word for a birch tree and its etymologically connected to English "birch". Her patronym, "Guðmundsdóttir", names her as the daughter of Guðmundur. The name Guðmundur can be translated as protection of God where "Guð" is cognate with English "god" and "mundur", meaning protection" is related to "mound" as mounds originally described embankments used for protection from flooding.-

RECIPE – LUTEFISK

A legend has that Viking fishermen hung their cod to dry on birch racks. When some neighboring Vikings attacked, they burned the racks of fish. A rainstorm blew in from the North Sea, dousing the fire. The fish soaked in a puddle of rainwater and birch ash for months before some hungry Vikings discovered the cod, reconstituted it and had a feast.

Today Lutefisk is a traditional food served at Christmas. Far more lutefisk is consumed in the USA than in Scandinavia.

Lutefisk

2 lbs. lutefisk 1/2 lb. butter

Cooking Procedure

Rinse fish in very cold water. Cut into serving size pieces. Tie the fish in cheesecloth for cooking since it is very tender and will fall apart. Place in cool salted water in a 4-5 quart sauce pan and bring to a boil. Cook for 10 minutes or until tender and translucent. Remove from water and serve with melted butter.

Lutefisk is traditionally served with boiled potatoes, green peas, melted butter and small pieces of fried bacon.

Fall is upon us and your Third District Board and its committees have been very busy working in all areas of District business.

The website committee met and determined that the district website was too old and recommended to the Board that a completely new website was needed, so I appointed a website search committee to get quotes (bids) from companies for what was needed for a user-friendly website that would allow us to add more things on as needed in the future. Cost for the new website will also be considered. This committee will choose the top 3 bids and refer those bids to the Board for a final decision.

Tom Bakos, Third District Youth Camp Director with Susan Olson, Third District Youth Director are working on having youth camp in summer of 2023. If you have children, grandchildren, nieces, or nephews of camp, age 8 to 16 years old, please consider having them attend youth camp so they can learn about their heritage and culture and make new friends.

Tom and the District Board are looking at sites for camp which would be in either New Jersey or New York. The final decision for the site will be decided at the Third District Board meeting at the end of October. The By-Laws and Policy Review Committee have been busy updating the Third District by-laws and polices since the new International Constitution and By-Laws came out in mid-September. The International Constitution and By-Laws are available for you to view on the Sons of Norway website. The convention policy committee has been working on convention policies for potential host lodges/zones which will help them to know what is expected of them and what they can expect of the

District. This will be a big help going forward as the policy book for conventions needed to be brought up to date and clarified.

<u>The Local Lodge Support Committee</u> (Team) has met several times and is working on ways to help lodges that are struggling with their membership, programs and getting officers. They have <u>renamed their committee</u> to the Lodge Revitalization Committee, a name that better fits their goals.

Going forward I am going to be starting zoom meetings with all the district lodge presidents so they can express their concerns about their lodges, zone, district, and Sons of Norway. Hopefully, this will also be an opportunity for the sharing of ideas among lodge presidents.

We have hopes to have zoom meetings with the District Vice President and lodge vice presidents coming up in the new year so they can discuss membership issues.

It is my goal to have better communications with all the district lodges and the District Board.
