

ABOUT KAREN ELLEKSEN, SPEAKER AT THIS MEETING

Karen Ellexson, earned her Masters of Science in Physical Therapy in 1996 and has been a practicing licensed physical therapist in Virginia for the last 26 years. She has spent most of her career in Geriatrics (20 years), specifically in long term care providing direct patient care as a staff therapist, providing team management and clinical program development as a rehabilitation director, area manager and clinical specialist. Caring for people living with dementia is a passion which lead to becoming a certified Independent Consultant and Trainer for Positive Approach to Care (PAC), and a Certified Dementia Practitioner (CDP). Karen has experienced the challenges facing people living with dementia from a professional standpoint, but from a personal perspective as well. Her father was diagnosed with early onset dementia at 57 and passed away at 76, nineteen years later. These experiences gave her the drive to be part of the change needed to raise awareness, spread knowledge and teach skills to better connect, communicate, interact and partner for care with people living with dementia. Karen is the founder of Sapphire Dementia Partners providing educational and consulting services for people living with

dementia and for those who care for them. She works with healthcare organizations, businesses, universities, and with families to increase awareness, develop knowledge and competent skill sets for caregivers to create a better quality of life for people living with dementia. She is a certified support group facilitator through the Alzheimer's Association, a member of the Alzheimer's Association political action group (AIM) Alzheimer's Impact Movement, and a member of the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) geriatric section.

NEW SWEDEN SETTLEMENT ON THE DELAWARE

In the 17th century Sweden was one of the great powers in Europe. They wanted to expand their influence in the New World. In 1626 The Swedish South Co. was established to colonize areas from Newfoundland, Canada and Florida. The first colony was on the Delaware River in present day Philadelphia, PA. The company sponsored 11 expeditions to Delaware between 1638-1655. The land was purchased from the Indians which is now Wilmington, DE. Swedish fur traders had already been trading since 1610. The settlements included Swedes, Finns and Dutch. In 1655 New Sweden was conquered by The Dutch and incorporated into the Dutch Colony of New Netherland. Traces of New Sweden can be seen in the Lower Delaware Valley including four churches. Also, The Swedish Historical Museum in Philadelphia contains many artifacts from the settlements.

Perhaps the greatest contribution of these colonies in the development of the New World is the log cabin. It is a traditional Finnish building technique that was used in Finland for centuries. It is an icon of the American frontier growth. We can also thank the Finnish for the sauna that dates back to 7000 BC. The sauna was an important building that they would build a sauna before they even built their cabin. An old

saying of the Finns is (" In the sauna one must conduct themselves as one would in church.") This strict reverence protected the sauna from corruption that other bathing institutions befell throughout Europe. As an effort to safeguard its cultural significance, Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden pushed for the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) to add "clinker boats" to its list of traditions that represent the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The nomination was successful, and the UN's cultural agency has since added it.
