Betty Keister Roseberry Lindsoe, 91, died peacefully on Sunday, January 17, 2021, two weeks after being diagnosed with COVID-19. Her last days, though medically difficult, were filled with love and laughter, virtual family visits, window visits, phone calls and other expressions of love. She is survived by her husband of nearly 50 years, the Rev. Dr. Joe T. Lindsoe.

Betty had a strong, unwavering faith in God. This faith gave her the strength to carry on after the early death of her first husband, Charles E. Roseberry. Betty put herself through college, receiving a BS in Elementary Education and a Masters in the Art of Teaching from Lynchburg College. At the same time, she raised her two young children, worked with the youth at Memorial Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and spent summers as a counselor at Craig Springs Camp and Conference Center (DOC). Upon her graduation from LC, she began her teaching career at Dearington Elementary School. After her marriage to Joe Lindsoe, she continued teaching school and participating in the life of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ.)

Betty was preceded in death by her parents, Margaret Howell Keister and Harry Price Keister of Radford and her stepson, Eric. J. Lindsoe. She is survived by her daughter, Resa Roseberry Payne and her husband Gary; her son, Greg E. Roseberry and his wife, Vicky; her stepdaughter, Dulcie Lindsoe Johansen and her husband, Mark; her sister, Anne Burnett, brother-in-law, Jim Burnett and her sister-in-law, Mari Bjerland. She is also survived by her grandchildren, Sharon Roseberry, Elizabeth Stinnett and her husband, Brandon, Benjamin Johansen, and great-granddaughter, Brooklyn Stinnett. PRESIDENT MESSAGE

Hello, Hello. February already. Hopefully in another month, we will see less snow and more sunshine. About every three years near my birthday the last week of January in Arlington and then Fairfax, VA., about we could expect a dump of 12-15" snow. Usually, we would get 3-5". All in-person meetings, as well as Zoom meetings when required, will be on our regularly scheduled fourth Saturday of a month, starting 1:00 pm. The regular in-person meetings will be from 1-3 pm. The Zoom meetings from 1-2:30 with a brief chat time replacing coffee/snack gathering.

The January 2021 in-person meeting was cancelled, so we met by Zoom. The lodge's first Zoom meeting was held with limited invitees (those who responded to last year's poll that they could access Zoom). Lucy Hochstein, co-Cultural Director, sent instructions for accessing the meeting. Lucy will continue to set up Zoom meetings when needed.

The meeting went well, with some assistance to adjust camera views and speaker connections. The meeting was opened with the speaking of the Norwegian, Canadian, and United States national anthems. Lodge president announced the date of the next meeting and the status of end-year-2021 SON required reports. The Program session was a chance for attendees to chat, one at a time, sharing how their families have done during this pandemic shutdown. It was so good to see those we haven't seen in a while.

Future <u>program</u> sessions will be arranged by co-Cultural Directors. The meeting was closed with prayer.

RECIPE - Swedish Apple Cake

(shared by Kathy Clark, From Scandinavian Press, Fall 2020 magazine)

Swedish Apple Cake

Ingredients for cake:

2/3 cup butter, room temperature

1/2 cup packed brown sugar.

3 eggs

1 1/4 cups flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

3 tablespoons milk

1 teaspoon vanilla

Ingredients for topping.

1 large peeled, sliced apple

2 tablespoons brown sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Process for cake:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Grease 8 x 11" pan or a springform pan

Process for topping:

Cut the apple in to thin slices. Mix with brown sugar and cinnamon. set aside.

Process for cake:

Beat butter and brown sugar until fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beating after each egg. In a separate bowl combine flour and baking powder. Add wet ingredients and stir in. Add milk and vanilla. Mix well. Batter will be thick. Spread batter into baking pan. Place apples in a nice design on top of batter. Sprinkle sugar lightly on top of apples. Bake 30-35 minutes.

Remove from oven and serve warm or cooled. Ice cream or whipped topping can be put on top.

Enjoy this classic Swedish cake.
