#### PRESIDENT MESSAGE

<u>BlaFjell revised Bylaws were sent to **voting-members** for review.</u> Version 1 was emailed January 7. Version 2 was emailed January 10. Although February meeting has been cancelled, responses (comments or <u>stating approval</u> are due to me by remote means by February 27.

At Third District President suggestion, in version two I added text from the SON-approved Sept 2020 Referendum allowing local lodges to conduct business remotely as well as at an in-person meeting. The template provided by SON did not state the referendum alternative process.

D-63 Lodge Update form (required by SON) was sent to SON International Fraternal Office by deadline. Each year, a lodge must report new or continuing officers and contact information to prepare an updated directory. Thank you to Kathy Clark, Blå Fjell's Corresponding Secretary for completing this.

Newly elected 2021-2022 officers assumed duties January 1. Members approved the option, suggested by District 3 President, not to wait for a formal installation because of difficulty getting together during pandemic. For the officer's information, I sent a copy of the abbreviated installation process we have used in the past when a designated district installer could not come to Salem.

Children's Activities Coordinator, Cheri Johnson.

This is <u>an informal title</u>. <u>Cheri</u> has offered to continue coordinating and leading the special children's programming <u>on behalf of Sons of Norway</u>, which she has done for several years. This includes: Adopt-a-School programming at Faith Christian School, and coordinating and leading St. Lucia procession at The St. Lucia Festival at St. Andrews Catholic Church.

Zoom session being planned. Lucy Hochstein, one of our co-Cultural Directors, has volunteered to set up a Zoom session this month. This will be our trial run. The purpose of the meeting is to include face-to-face contact with members who have not been able to attend any in-person meetings we may have. She will give me the access detail, which I will e-mail to all members for attending that meeting. If you do not use Zoom, you will be given a phone number to call to listen in on the conversation.

Canned Goods collection year-end report from Joann Barfield.

Ending the year 2020, total cans collected and forwarded to the Salem Food Pantry were 44 cans- good, considering the unusual circumstances as compared with 143 cans for 2019.

## From Bob and Sharon Rohrback. Story City Iowa and its Scandinavian Days.

In 2019, we were on our way to Des Moines, IA. We were too late for this festival but enjoyed a visit to an antique store nearby. The City has deep historic and cultural ties to the <u>Scandinavian</u> countries of northern Europe of <u>Denmark</u>, <u>Sweden</u>, and predominantly <u>Norway</u>. A large contingent of the City's current population is descended from a major immigration of people from Nordic countries in the 1840s through 1860s. This is evident in the large number of <u>Lutheran</u> churches in the community, which historically had sermons in different languages (Swedish, Danish, and Norwegian) respective of the makeup of their congregations.

Scandinavian Days began in 1965 as part of the Syttende Mai (17th of May) celebration, or Norwegian Constitution Day, that Story City's Immanual Lutheran Church held each year. Since then, the festival has seen many changes, but Scandinavian Days still rings true to its roots with traditional foods, folklore and a rich pride of the community's heritage. What amazed me is that she was more concerned about me looking at a strange man in the eye and not about seeing the King and Queen of Sweden.

#### **HUMOR**

From the book "Cows on Ice & OWLS in The Bog--the Weird and Wonderful World of Scandinavian Sayings". Each saying has two side-by-side pages (one side a picture; the other the English explanation. The title in the country's language was too hard for me to read.

- 1. <u>Swedish saying: "even small pots have ears."</u> In Sweden, the handles on cooking pots (even small ones) have ears. So, they know about burnt meatballs, overproved cinnamon buns, and close encounters in saunas. <u>Swedes use this phrase to</u> warn adults that children are in the vicinity and should not be allowed to overheat the conversation. Similar phrase "not in front of the children".
- 2. <u>Danish saying: "a delicious herring.</u> Picture a table at a romantic restaurant. A man proposes, the lady accepts, and he slips a ring on her finger saying, "You have made me the happiest man alive, you delicious herring". Doesn't sound like much of a compliment. <u>BUT in Denmark</u>, herrings are thought of very highly, and calling her this is one of the highest complements you can bestow.
- 3. <u>Finnish saying: "rye in one's wrist".</u> Popeye munched spinach to gain strength. Scottsman each porridge oats. <u>BUT Finns know</u> physical power comes from having rye in one's write. Choosing dark brick-like bread over fluffy brioche guarantees strength and success every time. The Swedes have a similar expression "rye in the back".
- 4. Norwegian saying: "talk straight from the liver". Have you ever come across a straight-talking Scandinavian? The chances are pretty high that you have, and that they used this phrase. This expression, which means someone speaks frankly and says exactly what he/she thinks, is from a time when people thought that the liver was the center of the body's feelings and emotions.
