#### From Joann Barfield: Copy of Hometown Memories Article Submitted to "Scandinavian Press" magazine.

I was saddened to read in the Summer 2021 issue of Scandinavian Press of the death of Larrie Wanberg, a prominent contributor to Scan Press and to the Norwegian-American newspaper, which some of our membership read. It was especially interesting to me when he wrote of his hometown in North Dakota, which was the town seat of my home (and of SON International Secretary, Marci Larson). Larrie was a son of the Rev. R. T. Wanberg, a large part of my youth; Rev. Wanberg was minister of our fourchurch Lutheran parish, including the Norwegian Lutheran Church which we attended when our Icelandic Lutheran Church was without a minister, and he married my parents. Rev. Wanberg was a prolific writer and made it a practice to keep in touch with couples whom he had married over the years; I had recently sent to son Larrie the letter that he wrote to my mother shortly before he died, and it brought back many memories.

Larrie Wanberg was a great writer and educator in many fields, and his death is a great loss to the Norwegian community. Once again, we see the wonderful benefits of the broad experiences of our Sons of Norway membership!

# Viking Village Discovered in the Norwegian Mountains

<u>Home</u> » <u>Viking Blog</u> » Viking Village Discovered in the Norwegian Mountains The remains of a settlement discovered on a remote mountain pass has been radiocarbon dated to the Viking Age. The findings confirm a local legend.

Norway's melting glaciers continue to reveal incredible archaeological finds. Now, evidence of a <u>Viking settlement</u> high up in the <u>Norwegian mountains</u> has been discovered and dated by archaeologists.

settlement, which may have housed a Norse chieftain, dates to roughly 800 A.D. The primary significance of the settlements lies in its age. The site, known as Stöð and located in Stöðvarfjörður fjord, shows human presence in Iceland decades before AD 874, the accepted date for when Iceland was permanently settled. A pair of books from the 12th century claim the island's first inhabitants arrived in 870 A.D. at the earliest; one of these texts, the Landnámabók or Book of Settlements, states that Iceland's first settler was Ingólfur Arnarson, who sailed from Norway to what is now Reykjavik with his wife, Hallveig Fródadóttir, in 874 A.D.

# SIMPLE FISH CAKES......makes 8

1/2 large onion 1 pound fish...cod, haddock 1 teaspoon salt 1 1/2 tablespoons potato starch 1/2 teaspoon white pepper 1 cup milk lightly salted butter for frying Pulse onion in a food processor for 30 seconds Pulse fish and salt for 30 seconds Add potato starch, pepper, and milk to onion, fish, salt mixture Shape mixture into 8 patties Fry in butter in heavy frying pan for 3 min. on each side Press finger in center of fish cake to test doneness Serve warm with brown gravy and buttery boiled potatoes or between a crusty roll

# NO COOK, STIRRED STRAWBERRY JAM.....makes 2 cups.....lasts 5 days in refrigerator

1 pound of fresh strawberries

1/3 cup granulated sugar
