

**Excerpt:** A group of brave adventurers ventures forth into a wild, unforgiving environment, full of snow and ice. They prosper for a while but then, as suddenly as they descended upon the massive island, they disappear. Those who come after them find only silent homesteads devoid of life. Even centuries later, researchers can glean only small details from the remains left behind by the colonists. Where did these people go?

That's certainly how the narrative of the Greenland Vikings goes if you consult sources like Norwegian missionary Hans Egede. According to the World History Encyclopedia, he arrived in Greenland in 1721, the first known European to land there since the local Norse people went quiet in the 15th century. Egede meant to convert the descendants of the Vikings who had settled there many centuries ago, but he was surprised to learn that no one was home. There were only long-abandoned ruins of farms, homes, and churches. After traipsing about the island and finding no one of Scandinavian descent, Egede instead turned his attention to the local Inuit people (via Visit Greenland).

But where had the Vikings gone? And how could an entire group of people disappear? Egede, focused as he was on Christianity and colonization of his own design, didn't really find answers. Later researchers have attempted to tackle these questions. They've gotten closer to solving the mystery, though some of the details still remain out of reach.

Many of us know the history of the Norwegian colony in Bay Ridge. <u>However, was this the first</u> neighborhood Norwegian immigrants inhabited? Where was the first colony? And when did it start?

Many people consider that the <u>beginning of Norwegian immigration to the U.S. took place on July 4, 1825,</u> when the "sloop" *Restauration* left Stavanger, Norway, for the U.S. Most of those passengers continued on to Kendall, Orlean County, in upstate N.Y.

The second mass migration occurred in 1880. At the same time, there was a transition from sail to steam. Many of the young sailors who came on these ships "jumped ship" and stayed in New York. Brooklyn replaced Manhattan as the shipbuilding, ship repairing, and docking center.

By the 1870s, migrating to first Brooklyn settlement, "Old South Brooklyn," near the shipping activity in Red Hook. In early 1900s, the third mass migration. Many of them settled in this first Norwegian community in Brooklyn. The churches followed the people to Brooklyn. One of these churches was the Bethel Ship, which was actually a ship moored off a dock in Red Hook. This church later moved to a regular building and became The Norwegian Seamens Church. The peak of the Norwegian community in Bay Ridge lasted through the 1950s or 60s.

What is the current status of the Norwegian community in Brooklyn? In the 1980s, the Norwegian Seamen's Church relocated from "downtown Brooklyn" to Manhattan. They hold

church services in Norwegian every Sunday. <u>Many other societies exist now</u>. The Scandinavian East Coast Museum. The Leif Erikson Society of Brooklyn. <u>The Scandinavian East Coast Museum</u>. <u>Two of the Sons of Norway Lodges established in Brooklyn are still active today:</u> and meet regularly in Bay Ridge: <u>Brooklyn Lodge and Færder Lodge</u>. Gjøa Sporting Club is still also active. <u>The 17th of May Norwegian Constitution Day Parade is still held in Bay Ridge</u> on the Sunday closest to May 17. <u>There is a new group on Facebook called Brooklyn Norwegians</u>. It consists of people who grew up in the Norwegian community of Brooklyn. They reminisce, trade recipes and old photos, and plan to march as a group in this year's parade.
