I'm happy to share a bit about myself. I am 54 and live on the Franklin county (Boones Mill) Roanoke county border with my wife of 32 years. She is a professor and the director of clinical education at Radford University's doctorate of physical therapy program.

My Norwegian background comes from my father's side of the family. An interesting side note is a Huth fort at Kjerringholmen islet on the Østfold archipelago exists. I spent my formative years in upstate New York, where I cross-country skied, biked, hiked, canoed, and spent much time enjoying nature and eventually meeting my wife.

My father was of German and Norwegian descent, and my mother and her immediate family immigrated post WW2 from Poland to Belgium and then upstate New York.

I have baccalaureate degrees in economics, physics, applied mathematics, and biology. ARTICLES/LINKS OF CULTURAL INTEREST

• Many people do not realize that young Leif was a Christian (from Cheri Johnson).

He was baptized in 999 by King Olav Trygerson of Norway! He was sent by the King to Christianize Greenland. His mother was the first convert! His father, Erik the Red, built her a church so she would have a place to pray. Of course Leif went on to discover Newfoundland (500 years before Columbus) and set up a base camp for future trips. He was young, adventurist, brave and a Christian, thus the cross on most of his statues! Don and I went to Newfoundland, saw the base camp, studied Leif, and stood below the giant statue of him with the cross! God is good and works in mysterious ways.

• The oldest Norwegian organization in America: <u>Ritter av Hvite Kors (RHK) organization</u> formed 1860, incorporated as SON Nora Lodge in 1938).

(excerpts of emails shared by Thor Jondahl SON member of a lodge in Chicago, and a friend of Bla Fjell lodge since moving to Virginia just over a year ago. Thor is doing research on this topic. In these emails he is emphasizing the need to do more research/publicity about this oldest organization and has contacted others to help as shown below).

Email to Sharon: I thought I would send you this e-mail regarding my remarks <u>about the oldest</u> <u>Norwegian organization in America</u>, RHK/Nora lodge. [He has also contacted two members of Norwegian Lag of which he is a member].

<u>My parents were members of RHK/Nora lodge</u> and although the RHK group in Norway consists of men only in the early 1990's they honored my mother in Norway for all her dedicated work within the American RHK/Nora lodge. Most of the records and other information about the American RHK was shared with Professor Odd Lovoll and are stored in the NAHA (Norwegian American Historical Association) archives on the campus of St Olaf College; Northfield, MN.

The RHK Lodge hosted the captain and his crew of the Viking Ship that sailed from Norway to be part of the 1893 Columbian Exposition in Chicago, IL.

Email to Dana Kelly at Norwegian-American Genealogical Center (nagcnl.org) Dear Dana:

Here is the information we briefly discussed this morning. Perhaps an individual at your genealogical center would be interested to do further research on this former Norwegian organization that still exists in Norway.

Emails to members of Norway R-DD Lag. Ardis a writer of articles and Sherrie is the Historian, Editor of the R-DD newsletter (Brev). What is a Lag? There are I believe 29 districts (communes) in Norway and a Lag represents one of those districts where your ancestors may have immigrated from. The R-DD stands for Ringerike-Drammen District one of the 29 different districts in Norway. All these lags fall under the Fellesraad organization, which meets in Minneapolis, MN. You can find more about this organization on the Internet.

To Ardis Danger: Your article in the May 2022 R-DD Brev (Volume 36 - Issue 2) entitled "Lier Municipality" was read with interest especially the portion dedicated to Colonel Hans C. Heg. As mentioned, Colonel Heg led <u>the 15th Wisconsin regiment</u> until he lost his life in 1863 at the Battle of Chickamauga. What really brought my attention was your citing that **the Norwegian flag used by this regiment was donated by woman's lodge Nora in Chicago**. Most American Norwegians don't know that the oldest Norwegian organization in America formed in 1860, in Chicago, IL was Den Ritter av Hvite Kors, RHK (The Knights of the White Cross), by a gentleman from Drammen. Note that this occurred 35 years before Sons of Norway organization was established in America. Eventually RHK purchased property and built their own meeting hall on Kedvale Ave. in Chicago (the yellow building is

still there but was sold 40-50 years ago). <u>In 1938 RHK (incorporated as Nora Lodge) joined the</u> Sons of Norway organization and operated as such for 50 years until disbanding in 1988, due to lack of membership.

To Sherri Framness:

Thanks for suggesting that I take on the task of more research on the former Ritter av Hvite Kors (RHK) organization. However, I feel that this would be better undertaken by someone closer to the files at St Olaf College in Northfield, MN. Previously I have asked a Viking magazine writer to publish an article in addition to suggesting that Vesterheim explore creating an exhibit focused on this organization. Unfortunately, neither have accepted this offer to date. Certainly, I will continue to seek the appropriate venue. Of course, you are welcome to publish my brief historical remarks in the next R-DD Brev. Thanks.
